History of St. Ailbe's School

St. Ailbe's School is under the auspices of South Tipperary VEC. The original school pre-dated the 1930 Education Act which established Vocational Education.

The school moved to the new building in 1977 where it resides today.

Throughout it's development, St. Ailbe's School has been to the forefront in educational advancement. It participated in the pilot programme for Transition Year which is now offered in almost all schools in the country. The school was one of the first in the country to offer Vocational Preparation and Training courses. Senior Certificate was a programme that was also piloted in St. Ailbe's and gained national acceptance and was later replaced by the Leaving Certificate Applied Programme. The school was also one of the first to offer the restructured Leaving Cert. now termed the Leaving Certificate Vocational Programme also now nationwide.

Several adult courses are also offered in the areas of childcare, office technology and health studies. These courses offer school leavers and mature adults the opportunity to join or re-join the national workforce.

Many new programmes, such as CSPE, were trialed in St. Ailbe's School and have subsequently being introduced nationally. St. Ailbe's School was one of the first to introduce an elected Student Council something that is now required in all schools.

The school was fortunate to have had two long serving and very innovative former principals in Pat Moroney and Paul O'Callaghan. Both served as engines of innovation and leaders for the school and the wider community.

The new principal Peter Creedon has proved to be an able successor and since his appointment has made some changes in curriculum and has brought his passion for sport and music to the school.

Junior Certificate Programme:

All incoming students will take the following subjects as part of our Junior Certificate Programme.

English, Irish, Maths, French, Geography, Science, CSPE, Religion, SPHE and PE

First Year Students study the following subjects as part of a **taster programme** and pick one subject from each block

Art Music Technical Graphics

Materials Technology Wood (Woodwork)

Home Economics

History

Business
Materials Technology Metal (Metalwork)
Materials Technology Wood

Transition Year- There is a strong academic focus to the programme, e.g. students take 5 Maths classes per week in preparation for their Leaving Certificate. Other aspects to the programme include: triple PE classes, triple Music, triple Activities



Highlights of Transition Year

Three day outdoor pursuit trip to Kenmare, trip to Phantom of the Opera, trip to Glenstal Abbey, trip to Limerick Jail, Build a Bank Challenge, UL Nuclear Fusion Lectures, Mental Health Awareness Programme, School Musical, First Aid Courses, GAA Coaching Courses, Rugby Coaching Badges, RSA Car Safety Course.

Leaving Certificate

Subject Choices

The following subjects are offered to students in 5th and 6th year.

English, Irish, Maths, PE and Religion are core subjects and the following subjects may be offered based on demand:

French, Art, Music, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Business, Geography, History, Design and Communications Graphics, *Engineering Technology, Home Economics, Construction Studies, Agricultural Science,

*Engineering Technology— St Ailbe's is the only school in Tipperary town offering this subject.

Uptake of Subjects at Higher Level:

Our policy in St. Ailbe's School is to challenge all students to take higher level options. National figures for those taking higher level Maths in the Leaving Certificate in 2012 were 22%. In St. Ailbe's 37% of the current intake of Leaving Certificate students are taking higher level Maths.

In subjects such as Materials Technology Metal, Materials Technology Wood, Home Economics and Art the percentage of students taking higher level at St. Ailbe's School well exceeds the national average.

Continuous Assessment

Four sets of formal exams are held each year to ensure that students work consistently throughout the programme. St. Ailbe's School holds two Parent Teacher meetings per year and regular feedback regarding homework is given via our Student Journal.

Small class sizes are an unique feature of 5th and 6th year in St. Ailbe's. Many of the subject options have less than 15 students per class allowing for more effective teaching and learning.

Leaving Certificate Applied Programme (LCAP)

As part of our tradition for catering for the needs of all our students, we also offer the LCAP for students who wish to follow a practical programme with a strong vocational emphasis. It is an innovative approach to the way students learn and the way they are assessed.




St. Ailbe's School can proudly state that it's facilities are amongst the best in the country





Student Support

Pastoral Care



The school Principal leads St. Ailbe's School Pastoral Care Team. This team meets once a week to ensure that student welfare and wellbeing is addressed in an appropriate manner. Each Year group is assigned a Year Head, who meet with the Principal and liaise with all subject teachers. All members of management and staff exercise a caring role towards our students.

Learning Support

The Learning Support Team work closely with parents/guardians and subject teachers to put the necessary supports in place for students. Our resource teachers provide tuition to individuals and small groups. Our aim is to enable all students to reach their full potential.

Student Support Team (SST)

Our school support team run homework clubs and after school activities. The SST room is open each day for students to play board games or just drop in and chat. This is an invaluable service for first year students in particular.

Home School Community Liaison (HSCL)

Our HSCL Coordinator is available to support students and parents with any issues relating to school. Courses such as *an introduction to project maths* are run to assist parents/guardians with their child's learning.

Guidance and Counselling

St. Ailbe's School has a full time guidance counsellor who provides a continuous system of support and counselling to students at all stages of their second level education. The ultimate aim is to guide students in making key decisions in areas such as subject choice, course and career choice. The guidance counselling service is delivered through one-to-one personal interviews and through classroom instruction.

Canteen Staff and Auxiliary Staff

Our students can avail of free breakfast each morning and subsidised meals at lunchtime. Tea and scones are also provided free of charge before evening study. Our canteen staff and caretaking staff are very friendly and supportive of all our students and are invaluable in maintaining the characteristic spirit of St. Ailbe's School

Our School Day

- Our day is broken into 9 class periods, 4 before morning break, 2 before lunch and 3 in the afternoon.
- * The School Principal & Year Head hold a weekly assembly with Junior Cycle students on Tuesday and Senior Cycle students on Thursday.
- Sport & music take place during our fifty minute lunch break and also after school.
- Only 5th and 6th Year students have permission to leave the school premises between 1pm and 1.50pm.
- Evening study takes place from 4pm to 5.45pm Monday to Thursday.
- Homework Club takes place from 4pm to 5pm

Bus Services:

The regular school bus service is available. This is supplemented by the *Ring-a-link* bus providing a "door-to-door service" from the Annacarty and Cappawhite areas. This leaves the school at 5.30pm each evening, allowing students to attend evening study (Contact School Principal for details).
